

Meet in the Middle

John 13: 34-35 "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. ³⁵ By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Matthew 22:36-39 "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" ³⁷ He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the greatest and first commandment. ³⁹ And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'"

If we were to summarize what Jesus said is most important, we are to love God, neighbor (even our enemy neighbor), and love one another. Yet the headlines from the Christian blogosphere this last month included: 1. The death of Fred Phelps—the founder of Westboro Baptist Church known for displaying who God hates. 2. Division and intolerance within the universal Christian church was on full display in the response to World Vision's initial decision of becoming more inclusive in it's hiring practices proceeded by the immediate backlash from much of the evangelical church that led the charge resulting in withdrawing it's support of 10,000 innocent children, and the immediate retraction from World Vision that went back to it's original discriminatory hiring practices. The messaging from inside Christianity has been anything but loving God, neighbor, and each other. To those outside who we are called to share good news, they have instead witnessed name calling, division, and hypocrisy. The public relations problem continues that Christians are known more for what they are against than who they are for.

Meanwhile, back at the ranch, I am thankful to be walking alongside a body of Christ who have witnessed what it means to love one another. In a week that I was enjoying some time away with family, our community back home was visiting our friends in the hospital, supporting families in a time of need, helping plan memorial service details, and baking lots of cookies to share. The providing, visiting, and sharing came from a genuine love of one another. Not once was there a litmus test for providing. No one asked first of another's politics. Questions did not measure another's worth. I am proud and thankful of our community at Spirit of Life that comes together from all walks of life to celebrate what we share in common—a love of our Triune God, our support of our neighbor, and our love for one another. Whenever our disagreements begin to lead to division, may we find ourselves joining together at the foot of the cross. This Easter season, may we be reminded of God's ultimate display of love of dying and rising to restore with us a relationship. May this relationship continue to guide us in how we meet one another as our dear friend, Clarnell Holtz shared in the life she lived. In a life where faith was central in guiding her love of God, family, church, and neighbor. Even in our differences—may we

PINEAPPLE ORANGE CAKE

1 package yellow cake mix

1 can (11 0z) mandarin oranges, undrained

4 egg whites

½ cup unsweetened applesauce

Topping:

1 can (20 oz) crushed pineapple, undrained

1 package (1 oz) sugar-free instant vanilla pudding mix

1 carton (8oz) reduced-fat whipped topping

In a large bowl, beat the cake mix, oranges, egg whites and applesauce on low speed for 2 minutes.

Spray a 9x13 pan with cooking spray

Pour cake mixture into the 13x9 baking pan.

Bake at 350 for 25-30" or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool on a wire rack. In a bowl, combine the pineapple and pudding mix.

Fold in whipped topping just until blended. Spread over cake. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour before serving.
