Announcements...

Our **nursery** (2nd floor) is open during worship for children ages 1-6 years.

Throughout the month, we collect change and then bring it on the second Sunday (October 13) to give in the "Change for change" bucket offering. With the help of our children, we continue collecting change in our metal buckets on a monthly basis. This is a great teaching tool to help us show each other and the younger generation how fun it is to give when we hear the change drop in the buckets!

Children's K - 5th grade will be dismissed shortly after worship begins and have Sunday school class during worship. Kids 6th grade and older will meet for Sunday school following worship. Adult Sunday school class will also meet following worship. The adult Sunday School class will be highly participatory and highly flexible. Two daily devotional books will be featured one that focuses on thoughts that might be of greater interest to men and one that may be more appealing to women but of course will be interchangeable. Or if you have a favorite daily devotional that you would like to share your thoughts about, that would be encouraged as well. Participants will be asked to choose one of the week's daily devotionals and share why it was the most meaningful or raised the most questions in their minds. By sharing our experiences it is hoped that we continue to grow our understanding of how God works in our lives. The schedule will be flexible as there are several Sundays this fall when other activities are planned immediately after service. These discussions will be easy to pick up on as each session will be independent of previous or succeeding sessions. All adults are encouraged to join the class when you are able.
