GriefShare: Many of us have suffered the loss of a loved one, someone dear to our hearts who has been an important part in our lives. The grief that we encounter can be overwhelming at times and causes us to reach out for help.

Spirit of Life Presbyterian Church is initiating a 13 session Christ centered program produced by a network of thousands of grief recovery groups meeting around the world. The group will meet weekly on Thursday evenings at 6:16. With GriefShare you will learn how to walk the journey of grief and be supported on the way. It is a place where grieving people find healing and hope.

We began the series last week but you can still join us on Thursday evenings at 6:16 to 8:16 pm in person in the Sanctuary of Spirit of Life Church. We will skip the week of Thanksgiving and then restart the weekly Thursday series on December 2.

This will be the second series that we have offered with past participants recommending that the program be repeated. After our 2020 South of the River CROP Hunger Walk was modified due to pandemic restrictions, we are LIVE again this year for our 9th annual walk, and it will be hosted by Spirit of Life! The date is October 10, registration starting at 1:30, and the Walk starting at 2:00 pm. We will walk down Pilot Knob Road to Farquar Park, and back again, for a distance of about 3 miles. Masks will be required as you sign in and gather, but once the walk gets started, and people space out, masks will be optional. CROP Hunger walks are locally organized events under the sponsorship of Church World Service for the purposes of raising awareness about hunger globally and locally, and to raise money to step towards ending hunger sustainably and permanently. Seventy-five percent of funds raised go to support CWS in their global and US based efforts for hunger relief, disaster assistance, and development. Twenty-five percent of the funds we raise will go to support Second Harvest Heartland, a food bank that supplies all of our local food shelves. Even though we had a "virtual" walk last year, our CROP Walk raised enough funds to make it into the top 100 Walks in the country — and the ONLY Minnesota walk to do that!
