


Watch for the light.

Spirit of Life Presbyterian Church Session Minutes – September 19, 2013

A quorum was present (7 of 9 Session members) for the Session meeting on September 19, 2013. Pastor Smith offered an opening prayer and devotion based on Roy Oldenburg's writing "Great Good Place, and Celebrating the Third Place". First place is home, second place is work, and the third place is the informal gathering place where we find belonging. Pastor Rob gave his report concerning many successful activities in August including Kid's Camp, hosting the Matsiko Orphan Choir, outdoor meal/worship and new pastor group. A new member class will be started in October. Minutes of the Aug 15 stated Session meeting were read and approved. Attendance was reviewed. Team Reports included the Christian Ed committee report on a successful start to the new Sunday school year with 25 students enrolled and an adult class also. The Wednesday after School program will begin Oct 23, 2013. Pastor Rob will be seeking volunteers for activity time, bible time and family meal time. Outreach committee report concerned press releases for CROP walk and Wednesday after school program. Worship and Music report concerned the Oct 6 World Communion Sunday, there will be a special collection, an international pot luck, and a baptism. Oct 13 will be tentatively a Jazz service followed by the Crop Walk. Advent will begin Dec 1, Carols and Cocoa will be Dec 14, and Christmas Eve service will be Dec 24 at 7:00 p.m. Community Service report concerned the ongoing harvesting of vegetables from the garden and delivery to Rosemount Food Shelf. Week of Community service will be held Oct 6-13 as an opportunity to serve our community in some way each day, including Oct 5 outdoor clean up, Oct 6 indoor clean up, Feed My Starving Children and the South of the River CROP walk. A fund will be set up for donations to help educate for one year a student from the Matsiko Orphan Choir. Stewardship committee reported on plans for the fall. Oct 27 will be a dinner for Session and Deacons, Nov 3 will be kick off Sunday and Nov 24 will be Consecration Sunday and Brunch. HUB report concerned the outdoor clean up on Oct 5, the tree trimming in Nov, the outdoor leaky faucet, the broken inside door lock, and a security door for the Montessori. Hub will also be looking into a different cleaning service and professional grade carpet cleaning. Personnel committee report concerned a first year review for Pastor Rob in Sept followed by reviews for Trista and Kate in Oct. We are also looking for volunteers to help with the nursery. Deacon's minutes submitted by Loretta Hunt were also reviewed.

Old Business included the mentoring to start with the new member class in Oct and the Confirmation class starting in Nov. The Deacons will be responsible for the care list of members and friends of the church. The Worship and Music committee will be responsible for setting up Communion leads, ushers, greeters, and lay leaders. The Deacons will be responsible for coffee and cookie hosts. The financial report was given by Barb Ostlund. We are \$17,000 under budget of that, \$13,600 is pledges. Pastor Rob will remind members to get up to date on their pledges. Our bank account has been converted to non-profit status with on line banking. The Session approved credit cards for Barb, Rob, and Shari. Concerns and joys of individuals were expressed and prayers were offered to close the meeting.

Spirit of Life Presbyterian Church Session Minutes - October 17, 2013

A quorum was present (9 of 9 Session members) for the Session meeting on October 17, 2013. Pastor Smith offered an opening prayer and devotion based on Psalm 36 and a blog titled "achurchforstarvingartists". Interesting tidbits from the blog were discussed. The financial report was presented by Barb Ostlund. It was moved, seconded and carried that we accept the financial report and have no change in the 2013 budget and acknowledge Barb Ostlund's comments that giving has been down. Pastor Rob gave his report. It was moved and seconded and carried that we register for "Camp in a van" for \$1000 plus mileage. It was suggested that we charge a small fee of maybe \$25 per child to help offset the cost of "Camp in a Van". We could have scholarship money for those who could not afford the \$25. Our first choice for date of "Camp in a Van" is June 22-27. Our second choice is July 6-11. Our third choice is June 15-20. It was suggested that the choir present Christmas music on Dec 22, 2013 for the final service at First Presbyterian at Farmington. Pastor Rob will check with Kate Olaf and the Farmington church to see if this will work. It was moved and seconded and carried that we use memorial funds and the Multi-Media System fund for purchasing hand held wireless and head set wireless microphones. Pastor Rob reminded Session members that Saturday, Dec 21, 2013 is the Session/Deacons Christmas party hosted by Pastor Rob and Lisa Smith. Minutes of the Sept 19 stated Session meeting were read and approved. Attendance was reviewed. Team Reports included the Christian Ed committee report. There was a discussion concerning funding for the Wednesday afterschool program M&M. Donation envelopes will be placed on the dinner tables. There was a discussion on advertising/marketing for M&M. We will put the plywood signs up on Pilot Knob Road advertising M&M. Outreach committee report was given by Peggy Roeske. No Session action was required. Worship and Music committee had no report. Community Service report was submitted by Chris Sachs. Julie Raatz added that we have collected enough donations to sponsor Evelin from the Matsiko World Orphan Children's Choir for one year and probably enough for another child also. No Session action was required. Finance Committee reported that the audit was conducted on Sept 21, 2013. More information was needed so there will be a full report in Nov. Stewardship committee report was given by Rebecca Brandt. There was no Session action required. HUB report was given by Denise Lewis. There was no Session action required. Personnel committee report was given by Julie Raatz reviewing Pastor Rob's review which was very positive. Deacon's report was submitted by Loretta Hunt, recording secretary for the Deacons. They met Oct 10, 2013. There was no Session action required.

Old Business The mentoring project will start with the new member class of Oct 2013. Confirmants will be asked to suggest 2-3 options for their mentors. Pastor Rob will confirm the mentors for both the new members and the confirmants. We discussed the care list of members and friends of the church and it was decided that only the Deacons would be responsible for contacting people on this list. We also discussed having Session members be responsible for one month of Communion lead. Worship and Music committee will be asked to come up with a plan for ushering, greeting, and Lay leaders. Deacons would still have the responsibility for coffee/cookie host. We discussed the Communion Schedule for 2014. It was moved, seconded and carried that we have communion on the first Sunday of each month and Maundy Thursday, Easter, and Christmas Eve and that the frequency of intinction or "in the seats" communion be referred to Worship and Music committee. New Business There was no new business. Concerns and joys of individuals were expressed and prayers were offered to close the meeting. Special E-vote Friday, Nov 1, 2013: Pastor Rob notified the Session members by e-mail that two Girl Scout troops had requested to meet at our church building beginning in November. It was moved, seconded and carried that we welcome the two Girl Scout troops to meet at our church. A donation of goods or services should be requested at the discretion of the HUB.

SWEDISH RICE PUDDING WITH LINGONBERRIES submitted by Ruth Shepard

4 c. half and half

1 tsp. almond flavoring

3/4 c. long grain white rice

2 T. sugar

1 jar Lingonberries (FELIX brand, in a glass jar, are good to use for this. Available at CUB)



Place half and half, rice, & salt in the top of a double boiler, cover. Place water in the bottom of double boiler & bring just to the simmering point. Cook over the simmering water stirring every 15 minutes until the rice is soft. Combine eggs, almond flavoring, & sugar. Whisk this while slowly pouring the warm milk into the mixture. Careful, a little at a time, fold the egg mixture into the cooked rice. Turn heat off & let set to cool. Chill until serving. Serve with the Lingonberies. I like to serve at room temp.

1/2 c. milk, warmed

2 extra large eggs, slightly beaten
