

Winning in a Zero-Sum-Game-World

Isaiah 2: 4: He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

After being away from routine for two weeks, my homecoming was met with grief and sadness as I turned on the news. Alone, the tragedy that escalated in the last two weeks between Israelis and Palestinians makes my heart ache. Add to this the senseless shooting of an airliner full of civilians, leaders avoidance of leading for justice with compassion for unaccompanied children fleeing violence, and I am ready to pull up my spandex and saddle my bike to escape a hurting world.

While acknowledging the reality of the complexities of the conflicts that surround us, may we be challenged even more so to become more knowledgeable by broadening the scope of information we receive. I would encourage all of us to be open to go deeper, to hearing different sides, and challenging our sources of information that tend to support the way our ideological wind is already blowing. For one of the great injustices perpetuating division today is our tendency to live in our own echo chambers that only compounds the zero-sum-game thinking that categorizes my winning at the expense of the other losing. It is this kind of thinking that

expense of the other losing. It is this kind of thinking that dehumanizes and demonizes the other at the great cost of sacrificing collegiality or compromise by castigating this as weakness resulting in an all in, winner take all world. Martin Luther King Jr. said it best, "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that."

Thankfully, our journey is paved by an unconventional and different kind of leader. A leader who entered into the fray of conflict to stand for the marginalized, oppressed, and

the outcast. A leader who when the going got tough, proclaimed in his most challenging moment to the masses that had turned on him, "Forgive them, for they know not what they do." In a world that wants to display its power through military might and prosperity, may we open our eyes to the power displayed in Jesus Christ—the power found in the paradox of weakness. The power of entering into humanity in the weakness of a baby, born of a single mother, who didn't have a place to lay his head, and who died a criminal's death on a cross. A leader who challenged zero-sum thinking by challenging the power structures. To follow this leader means to live by the example already set by being willing to carry a cross. May this confront us as much today as it did 2000 years ago by redefining the term 'winning.'

Winning as a follower of Christ, may we risk together entering deeper, and leading ourselves unconventionally to seek kindness, love justice, and walk humbly together with our God. Winning means we can go deeper and are willing to risk asking hard questions and challenge conventional thinking that is quick to align our self-interests with conveniently labeling the good guys and the bad guys. Winning, may we have the humility to find conviction in the many stories that challenge status quo by raising up examples of the Samaritan being the neighbor, or celebrating the degenerate son who squandered everything, or the many references of the outsider as the one who displays the greatest faith. To follow in the way of Jesus Christ, may our eyes be opened to shatter the categories that label others as 'enemy.' For if we were to really learn what it means to love our enemies, we would truly discover that there is only one kind of person, and we call that person our neighbor. The easy path is to jump back on the bicycle and hide from the conflicts that surround us, or to align ourselves into groups of like-mindedness. But to bear our cross means we enter into the struggle and truly wrestle with what it means to live as a disciple of Jesus Christ. For all of God's people, may God's love and mercy prevail.

A quorum was present (6 of 9 Session members) for the Session meeting on June 19. Pastor Smith offered an opening prayer and devotion based on Mark 3:13-15 – the appointing of the apostles and Matthew 28:16-20 - the Great Commission and Acts 2:1-21 – Pentecost video. Clerk Johnson welcomed the new Session members, Walt Ullrich, Bob Shepard and Deon Ford and returning Chris Sachs. She thanked retiring members Denise Lewis, Marge Lewis, Leslie Hohmann. New Session members received training Wednesday, June 18, 2014.

The financial report was given by Barb Ostlund. Contributions year to date are \$51,700 which is just over budget. Per Capita donations from members cover about 50% of the bill so the rest is paid out of the General Fund.

Pastor Rob gave his report. He discussed welcoming guests without overdoing it. The group Narcotics Anonymous will be meeting weekly on Saturday evenings at our church building and giving a donation.

Clerk's report was given by Clerk of the Session Karen Johnson. The minutes for the May 15, 2014 and the Congregational meeting on June 1 were approved as read. Attendance report was reviewed.

Team Reports were given. Welcoming Guests committee report was submitted by Marge Lewis, no action required. Youth and Children's Programming committee will be meeting June 22, Sunday, no action required. Outreach committee report was submitted by Peggy Roeske, no action required. Worship and Music committee had no report. Community Service committee report was given by Denise Lewis. Crop Walk planning is under way. Our church will sign-up for just.good.food, a Presbyterian garden for giving project. Kate Brause was thanked for volunteer work in the church garden. HUB report was submitted by Denise Lewis. Scouts and members were thanked for helping with the May 10th outdoor clean-up. Personnel committee reported that staff reviews are being done. Deacon's minutes for June were reviewed, no action was required.

Old Business

The usher/greeter/communion lead assignments were made for the rest of 2014. Session members were asked to list their choices for committee liaison positions, compiled by Pastor Smith. Session retreat will be September 13, Saturday, at Bob Shepard's. July and August Session meetings will be combined and held on August 7, 2014 at 6:30. New Business


