

God Save Us From God

When the skies are dark and all around us seems chaos with the news in Ferguson, Gaza, Liberia, and the terror of ISIS, I am quickly reminded of our recent small group study, *Surprised By Hope*, a book and study by Bishop N.T. Wright. Out of many things that I gained from this study, one that stands out is to consider how we live into the words of the prayer we recite every week "thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." This idea of 'Kingdom of God' that may seem so foreign is talking about God's kingdom here on earth. This shatters any of our categories that I like to think of as the 'evacuation model', a model that is so focused on saving oneself that it leads to a removal of our responsibilities to our neighbor and all of creation.

Jesus spoke much about living into God's presence in the here and now, or as we say in our more churchy words, "The Kingdom of God." Rather than the evacuation mode, this is one we live with our feet, where our street credit comes from how we walk the walk. When asked the most important of commandments, Jesus gave the most beautiful summary of God's law, "To love God with everything we got, and the same goes for people." (*translation mine*). So as people of hope in a world that is motivated by fear, how are we going to walk?

God's purpose throughout history has been restoration of all things. In the resurrection, God did something new. Brian McLaren, pastor and theologian, helped open new worlds for me in understanding a loving God in my journey through seminary education. One simple translation that helped me see God in a new way was to translate the word 'righteousness' as 'restorative justice.' In August as I was at retreat and Brian was the keynote speaker, he continued to help open my eyes to our amazing creator by looking at some of our most difficult and violent passages in Scripture, but not in isolation, but rather in the context of the many books. From the most violent texts of Judges, we looked at this next to the opening of Ruth followed by Matthew. You come to see an evolving and new understanding of God that culminates in one whose judgment is one of justice, who feeds the masses, and whose abundance is more than we could ever imagine.

To look at the larger story, may we be transformed to see God not as a God of violence, or as a God of patriarchy, or as a God of sacrifice, or as a God of choosing favorites, but may we see God as one whose purpose is loving and restoring relationships. Or as N.T. Wright shared in our study, "people who believe in the resurrection, in God making a whole new world in which everything will be set right at last, are unstoppably motivated to work for that new world in the present." While the news may make everything seem dark, may we live in the hope of sharing light in the darkness. This is reflected in how we love and care for one another and how we live out the belief of a God of non-violence, a God of inclusion, and a God of justice. From the words of the prophet Micah who shared a new vision of

With what shall I come before the LORD, and bow myself before God on high? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings with calves a year old? Will the LORD be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul? He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God? Micah 6: 6-8

2014 South of the River CROP Hunger Walk

Save the date! **October 12, 2014**, St. James Lutheran Church in Burnsville will once again host the CROP Walk. The event last year was very successful, with about 230 walkers, and funds raised totaling just under \$15,000, with everyone gathering in a festive atmosphere on a gorgeous fall day.

This year, the planning committee has set a goal for 300 walkers, and fundraising total of \$20,000. Three local agencies are designated this to receive a share of the funds raised: 360 Communities, Open Door Pantry (formerly Eagan/Lakeville Resource Center) in Dakota County, and the CAP Agency of Scott County. They will share 25% of the proceeds from the walk; the remaining 75% supports Church World Service in their global efforts to end hunger in a long-term, sustainable way. More information can be found at www.cwsglobal.org, and search for the South of the River CROP walk, or on Face book at Twin Cities South of the River CROP Hunger Walk.

The route has been shortened somewhat, and the direction reversed, AND there will be wonderful pre-walk activities again, including live music, children's games, and samples of homemade apple pie; frozen pies will be available for purchase, with proceeds going to the CROP walk. There will also be a food drive again to benefit our local agencies even more, and representatives from these agencies will be on hand to talk about the work they do to support food security in our communities.

You have several options for supporting this wonderful effort: You can sign up to be a walker, and raise funds for CWS. You can sponsor one of our walkers You can volunteer to help with registration or route logistics on the day of the walk. You can bring non-perishable food items to church for the food drive. You can buy a South of the River CROP Walk shirt. You can volunteer to help at the Sunset Pond rest stop.

Here's the recipe for the **Italian Beef Sandwiches** we served at Pat and Larry's anniversary celebration. I'm also including the Garlic Parmesan spread we served with the sandwiches. I can't take credit for the spread, but I've been asked for the recipe.

Italian Beef:

- 5 lbs chuck roast
- 2 cups water
- 2 pkgs au jus seasoning
- 1 pkg dry Italian dressing
- 2 cans small diced green chilies

Put all ingredients in a crock pot and cook on low for 12 to 24 hours. Serve on a hard roll.

Variations:

- use some of the liquid from the crock pot for dipping sauce
- melt mozzarella cheese on sandwich
- serve with garlic Parmesan spread (recipe below)

Creamy Roasted Garlic & Parmesan Dip (Makes about 2 ½ cups)

Ingredients

- 3 garlic heads
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup sour cream
- 3/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh thyme leaves
- ½ teaspoon kosher salt

Instructions

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Slice ¼ inch off top of each garlic head. Place garlic, cut side up, on foil and drizzle with oil. Wrap garlic in foil to seal. Place on rimmed baking pan and roast 1 hour. When cool enough to handle, squeeze out garlic. In food processor, add mayonnaise, sour cream, cheese, lemon juice, thyme, salt and garlic. Process 30 seconds or until mixture is smooth, scraping bowl occasionally with rubber spatula. Transfer to serving bowl; cover and refrigerate at least 2 hours or up to 3 days.
- Serve with crackers, toasted baguette slices, potato chips or cut vegetables.

Update on food shelf donation garden:

As of August 18, just under 150 pounds of fresh produce have been delivered to the Rosemount Family Resource Center. This has included fruit such as rhubarb and raspberries, herbs such as chives and basil, greens such as Swiss chard and lettuce, and other vegetables including radishes, snap peas, green and yellow string beans, zucchini and yellow summer squash, winter squash, beets, peppers, cucumbers, tomatoes and cherry tomatoes.



We will be participating in a new project from Minnesota Food Share, their Harvest Campaign. This program encourages local congregations to collect fresh produce and deliver it to local food shelves; the produce should be locally grown in home gardens or community gardens. So, if you have a home garden, you are invited to bring in some of your extra produce on Sundays in September, and we will add those donations to the harvest from our church garden, boosting our total donation to RFRC.
