As we are focusing over the next month, may we hear that stewardship is not limited to a season, or a Sunday, or even for the purpose of “funding the budget.” Stewardship instead is about transformation and salvation. To be good stewards is to be like trees planted by streams of water, with roots digging deep. It is in the roots of our relationship with God through being in the Word, joining in worship, prayer, and our disciplines that help us to yield rich fruit. With deep roots connected with living water, we can withstand the storms and drought that are part of the seasons of life. Together, may we live like this so that we are digging deep for the purpose of reaching out to others.

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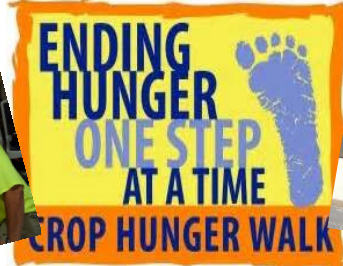

From Your Community Service Team:

South of the River CROP Hunger Walk wrap up

October 12 turned out to be a sunny, warm, blustery fall day, with gorgeous fall colors along the Walk route. All figures are approximate at this point, but we had about 200 walkers turn out. Our local agencies (360 Communities, Open Door Pantry, and CAP Agency) were well represented, and they led us off on our walk by carrying our new banner. We collected approximately 600 pounds of food, which our agencies could use to immediately stock local food shelves. They will also eventually share 25% of the money we raised, which is just under \$14,000 at this time. Thanks to all of you who supported the CROP Walk with contributions of various kinds, with prayers, with fundraising, by walking or volunteering. Thanks to Pastor Rob for leading a drumming circle at one of the rest stops. Thanks to our Scout Troop for helping with collecting food donations and gathering up Walk signs at the end of the walk. The South of the River CROP Hunger Walk represents a great opportunity for us to participate with other churches and community groups to help with something important—ending hunger one step at a time!



News from Community Service/Mission Team

Gardening season is over, school supplies have been collected and delivered, the CROP Hunger Walk is past—must be time to start looking toward the Thanksgiving/Christmas holiday season! ***Spirit of Life* will again be participating in the Armful of Love campaign through 360 Communities.** We have requested to be sponsors for 2 families, so look for more information on that in later November. We will also plan to bake, package, and distribute Christmas cookies again to our college students, service members, and less mobile members of our congregation; please notify Shari in the office if you know of someone who should be included on that list. We will not be participating in Operation Christmas Child, but will be participating in a Heifer International initiative. (If you have questions about this change, please talk to Denise Lewis) We will be collecting monetary donations for a Knitter's Gift Basket, which includes four fuzzy friends that are keeping Heifer partner families warm all around the world: a llama, an alpaca, a sheep and an angora rabbit—four animals that provide families with ample wool and endless opportunities to build better lives. Matsiko World Orphans Choir

In 2013, *Spirit of Life* began a friendship with the Matsiko World Orphans Choir, a part of the International Children's Network (ICN). We sponsored 2 wonderful kids from Peru for 2013/14. We are coming up to the time again when we'd like to sponsor 2 more children. The first 2 kids are in the program now so our thoughts are to sponsor 2 different kids. The cost to sponsor a child is \$35/month for a year so sponsoring 2 kids will be \$70/month. This provides for their education and minimal living expenses in their native country. This year there are 18 children in the Matsiko Choir from Liberia, West Africa, Peru and New Delhi. If you'd like to help us sponsor 2 children from the choir please make a check payable to *Spirit of Life* with Matsiko Choir in the memo section. It is important to note that all the children from Ebola affected areas were tested before they left their countries and after they arrived for the Ebola virus. None of them tested positive and all have been in the US more than 21 days.



Sponsoring them will be especially fun this year because the choir will be in the Twin Cities March 14 – 19, 2015. By that time, we'll already have chosen 2 children to sponsor and we'll get to meet them. When the choir is here, *Spirit of Life* has offered to help house the group. If you are able to help house the kids and adult chaperones, please let Julie Raatz know. We'd like to have housing arranged several weeks before they plan to be here. We are also going to work with other area churches to set up concerts for the kids. It would be great to have some help with that too.

Some background checking was done and we learned that Guidestar, the non-profit watch dog organization used by many Fortune 500 companies to evaluate charitable organizations, has given their approval to ICN since 2002.

Thank you for your willingness to house, feed and support these very special kids and adults!

Children & Youth Ministries

Children and Youth programs continue with good participation and energy! Sunday School and M&M are “thriving” thanks to a wonderful group of volunteers and teachers - and fantastic children! Plans are underway for a **Children’s Christmas Program on Sunday, December 14** during worship. All children and youth will be invited to have a part in this traditional and meaningful event. Since many of our volunteers head off to hand bells and choir, we would appreciate greatly help with meal clean up from 6:30 to 7:15 from those who might be available.

Registration for the **2015 Mission Trip** for our youth has begun. We anticipate sending approximately 16 people to Springfield, Illinois July 11-18. They will once again be doing maintenance and repair work for families in need, as well as nurturing their own spiritual growth with others.

Mama’s Awesome Manicotti by Alicia Mikoloski

1 small tub Ricotta Cheese
1 small tub of small curd cottage cheese
2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese
3 Tbsp sugar (more to taste)
Parsley (I like it when I can SEE it in the mix)
Jar of spaghetti sauce

Mix all and stuff into cooked Manicotti shells.



Layer sauce in the bottom of a baking dish, then shells, then more sauce. Cover with remaining cheese mix or remaining mozzarella. Cover with foil, cook about 45 minutes at 350°, then uncover and continue cooking another 15 minutes.

FOOD SHELF DONATION UPDATE:



The final total is a whopping 252.5 pounds of fresh produce delivered to the Rosemount Family Resource Center. This has included fruit such as rhubarb and raspberries, herbs such as chives and basil, greens such as Swiss chard and lettuce, and other vegetables including radishes, snap peas, green and yellow string beans, zucchini and yellow summer squash, winter squash, beets, peppers, cucumbers, tomatoes and cherry tomatoes. *Thank you* to those who cared for the community garden and to those of you who contributed fresh produce from your own garden.

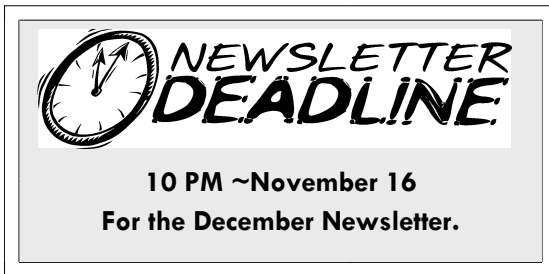
A VISION TO THRIVE! ~ submitted by Session

We heard a lot on Sunday about Survive to Thrive. Now it's time to move beyond a mode of surviving into one of thriving. *Spirit of Life* is a growing community in faith, so like any organization, it is critical to have a vision of where the church is headed in the future.

As a session, we've been focused on developing a strategic plan for the future. A critical part of any strategy is to determine what is it we are striving to achieve, so we have spent a great deal of time developing a vision of where we want to be, a mission that tells us the how we plan to get there, and goals, the actual steps we need take to accomplish our mission.

Spirit of Life Presbyterian Church Stated Session Meeting - September 18, 2014

A quorum being present (9 of 9 Session members), the meeting was called to order by the moderator, Reverend Rob Smith on September 18, 2014.

Pastor Smith offered an opening prayer and led a devotion based on Romans 14:1-12 and Matthew 18:21-35. Being in community calls us to value right relationship over being right.

The financial report was tabled until next month when Barb Ostlund is able to be here.

Pastor Rob gave his report. There were no action items. The discussion concerned the vote taken by our General Assembly to divest from three American companies which provide resources to Israel to go into the Palestinian West Bank territories. Bill Davnie will help Pastor Rob find a speaker to present this topic to the congregation following a Sunday worship time

Minutes of the Stated Session meeting on August 7th and Special Session meeting August 31st, 2014 were presented. Bob Shepard moved and Julie Raatz seconded the motion to approve the minutes as read. The motion carried, the minutes were approved as read.

Welcoming Guests committee had no report. Rebecca Brandt will follow up with Marge Lewis and Carol Osweiler who are chairing this committee. They have been sending e-mails and cards to visitors. Youth and Children's Programming committee report was written by Chris Sachs. Sunday school and M&M have started. A Children's Christmas program will be planned for December 14 during church service. No action was necessary. Public Relations chair Peggy Roeske had a written report. News releases were sent on Sunday School and M&M resuming and on the Garage Sale. A brochure about Spirit of Life has been completed and is available in the Narthex. No action needed. Worship and Music committee report was written by Karen Johnson. The worship services were planned for September, October, November, and December. There were action items. The Sign-up for Usher/Greeter/Communion lead for the months of 2015 was passed around. Committee chair Karen Johnson moved that we again take orders for Poinsettias and greens and the additional funds raised be designated to the Community Gardens. No second was needed and the motion passed. Mary Brause will lead the Christmas decorating this year. Committee chair Karen Johnson moved that we fund up to \$200 for decorations from memorial funds. No second was needed. The motion passed. Community Service report was submitted at the meeting by Deon Ford. Committee chair Deon Ford moved that we approve a bake sale fund raiser at the Garage Sale and funds raised be donated to the Crop Walk and we set up a special fund for the Rosemount Family Resource Center monetary donations specified for dairy and eggs. No second was needed. The motion passed. Stewardship report and timeline was submitted at the meeting by Bob Shepard. Elders and Deacons will be asked to make calls to all members, not just to ask for money but to make a personal connection. The Kick off dinner will be October 12th and all Session members and Deacons will be invited. A video was shown entitled "We were made to Thrive". HUB committee report was written by Walt Ullrich. Boy Scout Will is almost done with his project and there may be money left over after the memorial donations were received. October 4th will be the Scout clean-up day. Personnel committee report was given by Julie Raatz. They are looking for someone from the congregation to serve on the Personnel committee.

Adult Ed. report was submitted at the meeting by Brian Gracek. Adult Ed. Sunday School is underway with Carol Osweiler, Tony Winter and Brian Gracek rotating the teaching. Deacon meeting minutes for August 12th and September 9th were submitted by Loretta Hunt.

The usher/greeter assignments were updated. Bob Shepard will be the lead for October. Deon Ford will be the lead for November. Walt Ullrich will be the lead for December. Session members were reminded to attend the Session retreat at Bob Shepard's house on Saturday, September 20th.

There was no New Business.

Concerns and joys of individuals were expressed and prayers were offered. The meeting was closed with a prayer.
