He was a good role model indeed.

As a poet, he writes a poem that speaks as much about him as it does about my grandmother.

"The more you give, the more you have," She said to John her son,
And spoke, her husband knew full well,
From wisdom slowly won.

Pecan Shortbread Cookies

from Ruth Shepard

In a mixing bowl combine: 1 c. flour, 1/2 cup powdered sugar, and 1/2 cup cornstarch



In the bowl of your mixer, cream 3/4 cup unsalted butter Add to creamed butter 3/4 cup finely chopped pecans

To the butter mixture, add and the flour mixture and combine well.

Roll into walnut size balls and place on ungreased cookie sheet (cookies do not spread much).

Flatten each cookie using the greased palm of your hand.

Bake in preheated oven at 325 degrees for 20-25 minutes, until just starting to get brown around the edges. Cool a couple minutes before removing to a rack to cool. Makes 24 cookies

From the Community Service/Mission Team:

This year, for our Christmas overseas project we will be participating in a Heifer International initiative. We will be collecting monetary donations for a Knitter's Gift Basket, which includes four fuzzy friends that are keeping Heifer partner families warm all around the world: a llama, an alpaca, a sheep and an angora rabbit—four animals that provide families with ample wool and endless opportunities to build better lives. Our target is \$480, to by a basket for one family. Donations in any amount are welcome; make your check out to Spirit of Life, with "Heifer International" on the memo line. South of the River CROP Hunger Walk

The planning committee held its final meeting of the year on Nov. 3, and our final numbers were impressive! We collected 900 pounds of food that was distributed immediately to our designated local agencies: 360 Communities, the Open Door Pantry, and the CAP Agency. Total monetary donations were \$16,710, an increase of almost \$3,000 over last year! Our designated local agencies will share 25% of that total for local hunger relief efforts, and CWS will use the rest in their efforts globally, to establish consistent access to clean water, to provide education, and to provide tools and materials for communities to grow their own food—all to end hunger in a sustainable and lasting way!

Exciting news! Spirit of Life will be hosting the 2015 South of the River CROP Walk, bringing it further east in Dakota County, and hopefully making it easier for churches and groups in Apple Valley, Rosemount, Eagan, and Farmington to participate. The churches that have been a part of this CROP walk from the start have promised to continue to participate, both in planning for the Walk and in the Walk itself. Spirit of Life will be responsible for determining the Walk route, managing the logistics and safety issues of the Walk, as well as planning the activities and entertainment during registration. The date has been set for October 11, 2015; Denise Lewis will serve as the coordinator for the Walk. Many volunteers will be needed on the day of the Walk, but 2 or 3 people will be needed months in advance for dreaming and planning for the event. Spirit of Life Presbyterian Church Session Retreat Minutes—September 20, 2014

The Session was led by Bob Shepard in an exercise to identify our church's current strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats to identify and prioritize issues for Spirit of Life into categories. Session also developed goals for each category and suggested what committee should take responsibility for each category.

- 1. Diversity (Session responsible) We should educate existing membership on the value of diversity (not just racial but also generational, gender, etc.) so that church members can accept change. The church should appeal to our immediate neighbors (apartments and townhouses located nearby).
- 2. Aversion to Change (Session responsible) We should acknowledge fear, educate to diminish fears and increase awareness of the value of change.
- 3. Facilities (HUB responsible) We should try to catch the attention of drive-by traffic. We should better utilize the large, prime property we own.
- 4. Youth (Youth and Children's Programming committee responsible) We should define leadership and focus on youth (example hire a youth director).
- 5. Leadership (Session responsible) We should cultivate strong leadership with a focused vision including new members.
- 6. Community (Community Service committee responsible) We should provide further opportunities to serve our surrounding communities. We should increase visibility in the surrounding communities.
- 7. Participation (Session responsible) We should create a volunteer coordination team to recognize current volunteers and help new members and others plug in (to committees or events) according to their gifts and passions.
- 8. Finance (Stewardship committee responsible) We acknowledge that finances are a risk for us and we need to be good stewards but also step out in faith and strive to thrive. We should continue with faith and stewardship and our goal will be that increased finances follows growth.
- 9. Music (Worship and Music committee responsible) Music is a strength in "church service music" and "adult music". Our goal is to improve and grow the music program for the youth and the children and to grow in diversity.
- 10. Size (Session responsible) We acknowledge that there is momentum in our growing church service attendance and our growing children's programs attendance and we acknowledge that we are not in competition with other large churches. Growth is not about numbers but is about transforming lives.

After much discussion, it was concluded that our biggest goal is to develop a Vision Statement. Our Vision statement is "our dream for the future". Our Mission statement is "how we are going to get there".

After discussing each of the categories and the goals for those categories, Session members were asked to "prioritize what you felt was important" and "show where you would personally spend your time". The top "Priority" was Leadership. Diversity was the second priority. Size and Aversion to change were not priorities at this time. The greatest "Time spent" were Facilities, Leadership and Music.

Spirit of Life Presbyterian Church Session Minutes—October 23, 2014

A quorum was present as the Session meeting was called to order by the moderator, Reverend Rob Smith on October 23, 2014.

Pastor Smith offered an opening prayer. He led a devotion based on Matthew 28: 16-20, the Great Commissioning, and quotes from "The Unnecessary Pastor" by Eugene Peterson and Marva Dawn, in which Christianity is discussed as an alternative, parallel lifestyle.

The financial report for August and September of 2014 was sent by Barb Ostlund. The September report was not complete. It was discussed that the budget is behind by \$4375 as of August 2014. Expenses have been \$10,743 less than expected as of August 2014. Bob Shepard reported that the garage sale netted over \$5000 but this was not yet reflected in the financial report. It was noted that the primary mortgage was down to \$17,000 and that most of the payment is now principal so we should have this mortgage paid off in 18 months or so.

Pastor Rob gave his report concerning attendance, pastor visits, calendar of events, and outreach. There were no action items.

Minutes of the Stated Session meeting on September 18, 2014 and the Session retreat on September 20, 2014 were presented. Corrections were noted. Clerk of Session Karen Johnson was asked to write up the goals from the Session retreat and publish them in the next church newsletter. Attendance was discussed. Communications was the Presbytery Church Statement for the quarter ending September 30, 2014. \$674.79 is remaining on the Per capita pledge for 2014. Presbytery sent the 2015 Per Capita Apportionment, it will be \$32.77 per member.

Welcoming Guests committee had no report. Youth and Children's Programming committee had a report from Chris Sachs but there was no action needed. Public Relations report was written by Peggy Roeske but there was no action needed. Worship and Music report was written by Karen Johnson but there was no action needed. Community Service report was discussed by guest Denise Lewis. She discussed that we would not be participating with Operation Christmas Child this year but instead would be raising funds for a \$480 Knitters gift basket for Heifer International. We would also support Armful of Love and 2 children from the Matsiko Choir which will be here March 14-19, 2015. The Community service team moved that we allow members to donate to Armful of Love, Heifer International and the Matsiko Choir. After some discussion, the motion carried. Denise Lewis discussed the South of the River Crop Walk. In 2014, over \$14,000 was raised and more churches were involved than 2013, 200 people were registered, and 600 lbs. of food was donated to 3 food shelves. Denise recommended that Spirit of Life be the host church for the Crop Walk in 2015. Denise and Peggy Roeske will be on the Crop Walk committee. They said most of the volunteers would be needed on the day of the walk which would be the second Sunday in October. At the end of the Session meeting, a motion was passed that Spirit of Life be the host church for the South of the River Crop Walk in 2015. Stewardship report was given by Bob Shepard. Bob Shepard made the motion that we approve up to \$700 from the General Fund for the Stewardship dinner. The motion carried. HUB committee report was written by Walt Ullrich. There was no action needed. Personnel committee had no action items. Adult Ed. report was submitted at the meeting by Brian Gracek. No action was needed.

Deacon meeting minutes for October 14th was submitted by Loretta Hunt.

The usher/greeter assignments were updated. Deon Ford will be the lead for November. Walt Ullrich will be the lead for December. Deon Ford led the Session in a Visioning exercise. First we discussed "not just survive but thrive". Thrive means do what you do and do it well. Thrive means to bear fruit. We developed the vision "to be a dynamic community modeling Jesus". The visual that Deon drew on the white board showed a tree. The roots were love, grace, nurture, support, study/educate. The trunk of the tree is Jesus. The branches of the tree are community, warm and welcoming, thought provoking, show Jesus love, service/minister to those in need, follow Jesus, model Jesus. The canopy of leaves over all the branches is the Family of Believers. Next month we will finalize the Vision statement. Each committee should bring a list of activities for the year so that we can do a calendar of activities. Pastor Rob Smith is still working on a speaker on the General Assembly's divestment of stocks. Pastor Rob will e-mail options for dates for the speaker.

There was no New Business.

Concerns and joys of individuals were expressed and prayers were offered. The meeting was closed with a prayer.
